FBFN Foundation is devoted to giving back to Fort Bend County and its communities through the FBFN Foundation Scholarship Program.

Since 2005, over \$381,000 in scholarships has been awarded to local students planning to attend college at one of the Fort Bend County campuses of Wharton County Junior College, Texas State Technical College, Houston Community College, and University of Houston-Sugar Land.



ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for a FBFN Foundation college scholarship, the student must (1) graduate or have graduated from a public high school in Fort Bend County or be a current full-time student in a Fort Bend County college; (2) plan to attend a Fort Bend County college campus as a full-time student; and (3) be a United States citizen.

While need is a top priority, academics, activities in school and in the community, work experience, a personal letter from the student and recommendations from teachers, employers and community members are also considered.
